Road to the 7th World Water Forum

Marseille/Gyeongju, 21st February, 2014- Organized by 7th World Water Forum partners and the World Water Council, the 2nd Stakeholders Consultation Meeting for the 7th World Water Forum will be held on February 27 and 28, 2014, in Gyeongju, Republic of Korea. This event gathers stakeholders from all over the world to delve deeper into the Thematic Framework so as to develop implementation roadmaps that will lead to a Global Action Agenda. The meeting will likewise enable discussions on the Regional and Science and technology processes.

The consultation meeting is the second big stepping stone in the preparatory process leading to the 7th World Water Forum, and sets the stage for the preparatory activities running up to the 7th Forum, which will take place in Daegu & Gyeongbuk, Republic of Korea, from 12 to 17 April 2015.
