## The World Water Council addresses Water & Energy interdependence, opportunities and constraints at World Water Week in Stockholm

The World Water Week in Stockholm is organized by the Stockholm International Water Institute (SIWI) from 31 August to 5 September. This year's edition is drawing particular attention to the interactions and synergies to be built between water and energy.

  - What are the mechanisms and incentives to promote hydropower taking into consideration other uses of water, such as water supply, irrigation, navigation and ecological flows?
  - How can compromises between multiple stakeholders be found in diverse geopolitical situations so that water storage can help guarantee water security?

  - What concrete examples of green growth exist to help define sustainable development for both water and energy in a context of population growth, climate change, urban sprawl, water stress, etc.?
  - How can water and energy policies be coordinated to encourage green growth in both sectors?
- > "7<sup>th</sup> World Water Forum: Destination Daegu-Gyeongbuk" with the World Water Council and the 7<sup>th</sup> World Water Forum National Committee Sunday 31 Aug. 12:45 PM, room K16/17.
  - The World Water Forum is a multi-stakeholder platform that aims to bring people together from horizons far and wide to find new ideas and solutions to today's water challenges.
  - Organized by the World Water Council, the Republic of Korea and Daegu-Gyeongbuk province, the 7th World Water Forum will be held from 12 to 17 April 2015, building on the solutions that were formulated during the previous Forum and the outcomes of Stakeholders Consultations in 2013 and 2014.
