Editorial

SANITATION NEEDS SCIENCE, BUT FIRST, IT NEEDS AWARENESS

2008 is the International Year of Sanitation. This period must be used to attract the world's attention to the fact that one person out of two on the planet still does not have access to sanitation facilities that guarantee both adequate hygiene and privacy. Making sanitation a priority is both a right and a duty, which, in any case, must not be limited to the overly restrictive concept of access to toilets.

For the global increase in population provokes migration and pollution, rendering cities veritable sanitation time bombs. And we must say that cities, all cities, need a global purification policy. It is the very high price to pay for maintaining water resources at a level of quality that restricts the rise of water-related illnesses.

Less expensive and simpler technical solutions remain to be invented to enable maintenance that is adapted to climatic conditions. But especially, we must still persuade national and local decision-makers that water policies cannot be effective and sustainable if we do not dedicate as many resources to sanitation as we do to water.

Such are the stakes for this International Year of Sanitation: to inform, to explain, to convince others of the necessity for greater awareness around sanitation.

Development Assistance: From Statistics to Reality

Over the past few years public assistance for development, paid by the 22 members of the CAD (The Development Assistance Committee) has contributed to improving living conditions for the world's poorest populations. According to findings published by the OECD in the 2007 Development Co-operation Report (www.oecd.org/dac), despite efforts carried out to improve both on both quality and efficiency, the amount of aid is still extremely insufficient.

For the first time since 1997, in 2006 the amount of aid fell by 4.5% to 104.4 billion. Furthermore, this sum was comprised, in a large part, by cancelled debts (nearly one-third of the total amount,) as well as funds allocated to catastrophes greatly impacting humans, or to the education fees of foreign students and to funds allocated to housing for refugees in donor countries. To keep their promises, by the year 2010, CAD members should be increasing the amount of actual, annual aid by 12%. Yet another dilemma lies in the difficulty of ascertaining where aid should be allocated on a local scale, in recipient countries.

Assistance in the domain of water distribution and sanitation, which represents approximately 5% of the total aid, was the subject of a report titled, "Official Development Assistance for Water from 1990 to 2004 – Figures and trends," published by the WWC for the World Water Forum in Mexico based on data from OECD.

Congress on Achieving the MDGs for Water and Sanitation in Africa

Numerous experts gathered at the 14th Congress of the African Water Association on 25-28 February in Cotonou to exchange ideas on 34 topics covering water and sanitation in Africa. The African continent remains the most vulnerable in terms of access to water. This is why the Congress organisers asked professionals to propose concrete solutions to these problems.

Alongside Mr. Yayi Boni, the President of the Republic of Benin, Loïc Fauchon delivered an opening speech (available on the WWC website) in which he evoked what was at stake for the continent. The President of the WWC took advantage of the opportunity to meet with political as well as media representatives, and he also presided over a symposium dedicated to the assessment of the MDGs in relation to Africa and made a presentation on the 5th World Water Forum to take place in Istanbul. From Questions to Sessions: 2nd Thematic and Regional Coordinators Meeting

Enthusiasm, dialogues and involvement: the two-day-meeting on 7-8 February in Istanbul was a great success and marked an important step toward the definition of topics for the next World Water Forum. Some 500 participants, representing 200 organizations and institutions, actively contributed to round table discussions on the "100 Questions". Conceived prior to the meeting by the water community, these questions provided the basis for discussion aiming to establish a list of potential sessions and session organizers for the 5th Forum.
